

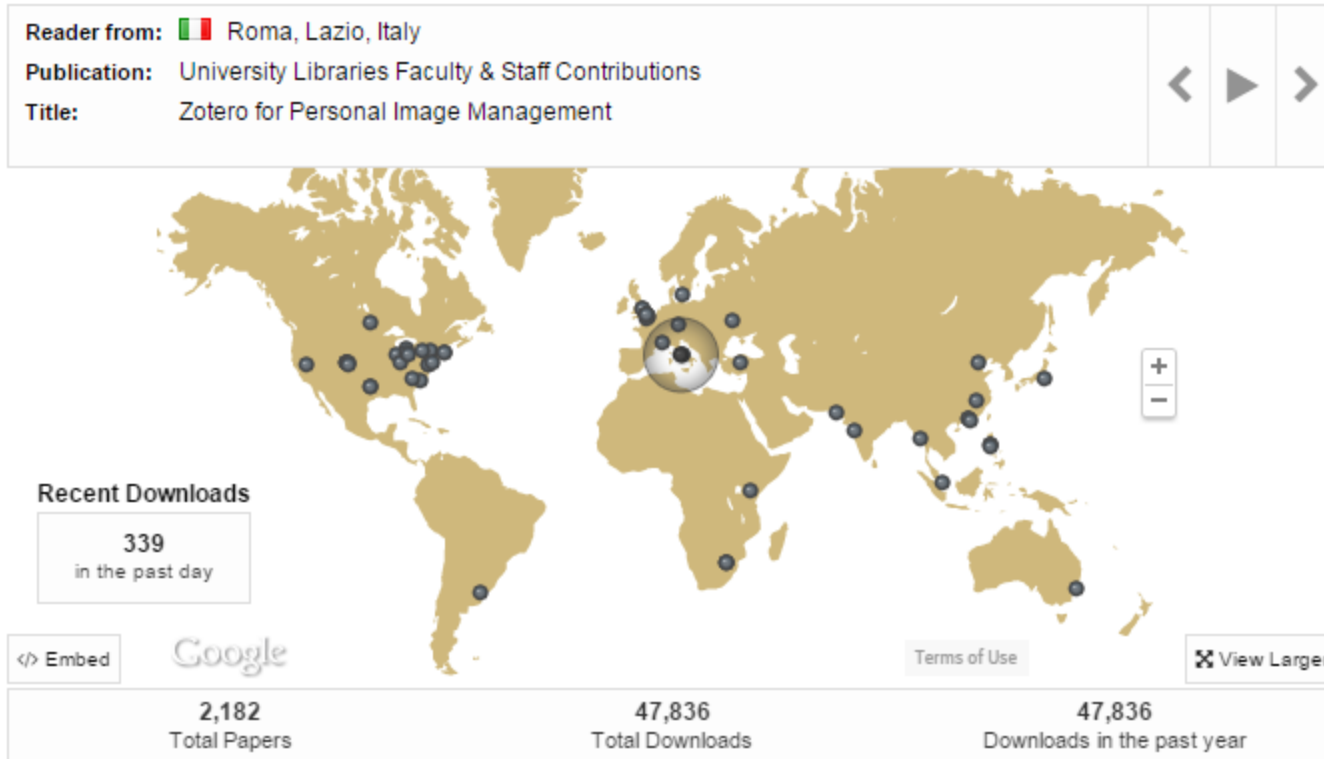

Increase Your Visibility!



- Works made Open Access are more discoverable and much easier to access
- Open Access articles can have a wider impact

Reach all your colleagues!



- Librarians are practitioners many of whom lack access to scholarly literature.
- For example many museums, public libraries, design schools, and small colleges don't have access to pay-walled library literature

Walk the Walk!



- Librarians can set an example by making their work openly available.
- Hard to advocate for others to do so, if we don't follow our own advice.

OPENLY?**

GREEN



- Can publish in journal of choice
- May need to negotiate rights
- May not be able to post final version
- Other re-use restrictions may apply

GOLD



- Have to publish in an open access journal
- May be author fees
- Openly available right away
- Usually allows more re-use under a CC license
- No negotiating rights
